

THEORY SYLLABUS

1. Geriatric Nursing (Care of the Elderly)

- Aging process – physical, psychological, and social changes
- Common health problems in old age (hypertension, diabetes, arthritis, dementia, incontinence, etc.)
- Nutrition for elderly and feeding assistance
- Medication care and observation of side effects
- Prevention of bed sores and complications of immobility
- End-of-life care and palliative care
- Emotional and mental health support for elderly.
- Care of dead body

2. Community Health Nursing

- Concept of health and disease
- Roles and responsibilities of ANM in community settings
- Home visiting and domiciliary care
- BCC (Behavioural change communication)

3. Health Promotion
